President Haynes holds a doctorate in social work from the University of Texas, serves on many local boards including the San Diego Chamber of Commerce, and has been honored with numerous "top women" awards during her tenure here. This should be a most informative program.

She serves on the regional boards of the

San Diego Chamber of Commerce and the San Diego Economic Development Corporation.

She was honored in 2007 with the San Diego YWCA's Top Women in Industry Award for contributions to the community and the San Diego Business Journal's "Women Who Mean Business" Award.

She and her husband and co-author, Jim Mickelson, are working on the seventh edition of their landmark text, "Affecting Change: Social Workers in the Political Arena."
