Lessons from A Simulated 7.8 Earthquake Along the Southern San Andreas Fault

Much was learned from the simulated earthquake exercise in 2008 that has helped planners and first responders do a more effective job when a real earthquake occurs.

Arnie Lewin was a state planner for the Governor's Office of Emergency Services for the largest state wide exercise simulating a major earthquake along the southern San Andreas Fault and will describe his experience in that exercise.

The focus on Operation ShakeOut was on the response and recovery from a catastrophic magnitude 7.8 (major) earthquake, with a rip zone



starting in the vicinity of Bombay Beach at the Salton Sea area of Imperial County and stretching to the vicinity of Lake Hughes in Los Angeles County.

The earthquake and resultant damage estimates have been developed by the US Geological Survey and other geologists and geophysicists to represent a scientifically supportable disaster.

The exercise included opportunities for activating mutual aid from other mutual aid regions of the state as well as integrating state and federal response activities described in the National Response Framework. Exercise planners focused on developing a training vehicle that will enhance response and recovery operations resulting from a major earthquake.

Mr. Lewin has been a member of the telecommunications staff for OES for the past seven years. Currently, in charge of all volunteer staff for OES Mutual Aid Region Six, that is, all Southern California counties including Santa Barbara, San Luis Obispo, Inyo and Mono. He has been involved in emergency communications for many years, has been a licensed amateur radio operator for over 40 years.
