on base. Meeting starts at 11:30 and the salad bar is only \$7.

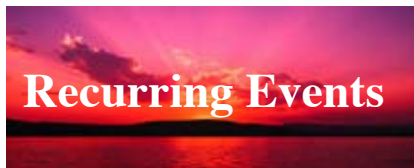

Angus are tired of carrying the load of reducing the average age below 95.

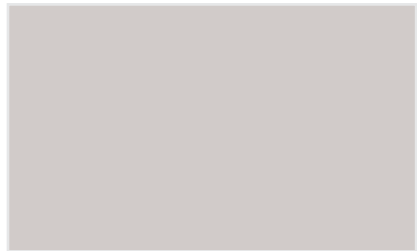
