The Do's and Don'ts for the Consumer

Chrissa N. Corday, Esq. attended Arizona State University (B.S. 1983 in Real Estate) where she was honored as the Most Distinguished Real Estate Student. She received her juris doctor from the University of San Diego School of Law in 1986 and was admitted to the California Bar in the same year.

Ms. Corday has focused her practice on construction litigation including dispute avoidance, construction litigation, mechanic's lien and

surety bond issues, contract disputes and insurance coverage.

Ms. Corday was counsel for the insured, a general contractor, in *Campbell v. Superior Court* (1996) 44 Cal.App.4th 1308, the first reported decision in California expressly holding that an insurer's unreasonable failure to defend can constitute a breach of the implied covenant of good faith and fair dealing.

Ms. Corday currently represents several local governmental agencies and nationwide surety companies. Ms. Corday lectures to continuing education audiences about construction claims and remedies,

and sat on the informal "indemnity" and "construction" panels for the League of California Cities' legislative lobbyist.

Ms. Corday was a delegate to the San Diego County Bar for 2004 and President of the Construction Law Section of the County Bar, 2001-2002.

Ms. Corday has acted as Chair of the Poway Unified School District's Citizen Oversight Committee overseeing the spending of \$198 million in Prop U bond money and is a member of the Citizen Oversight Committee for \$156 million in Prop C bond money.

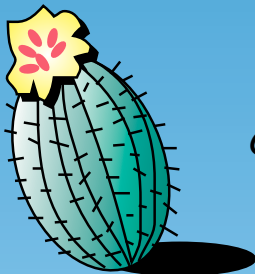

Rotary Board: Meets the 3rd Wednesday of each month at the San Diego Na-

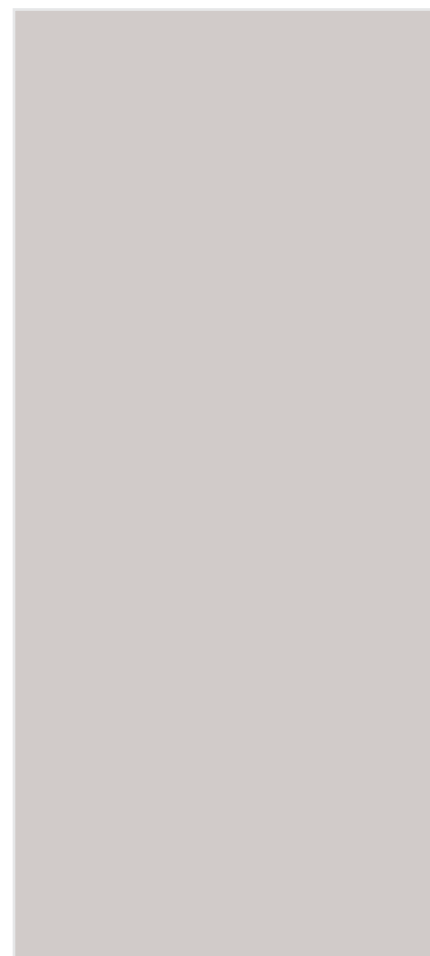
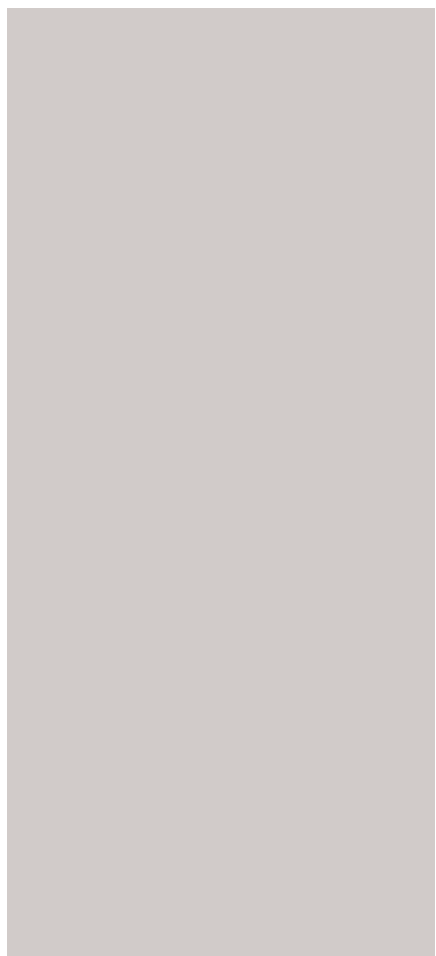
