reported two projects, the Community Park and work on 3 schools in the district. A sign up sheet is being passed around and he is requesting everyone help out.



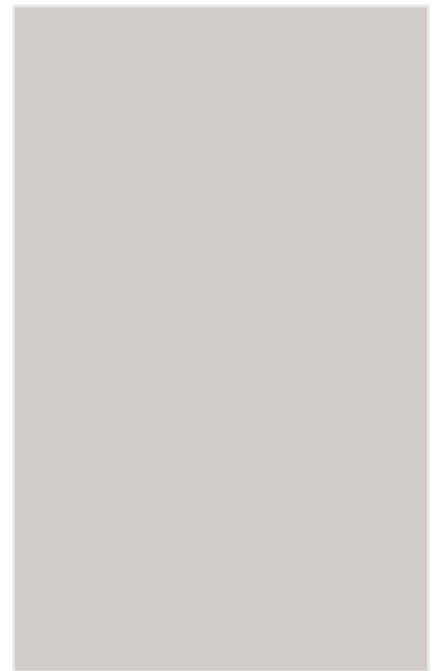

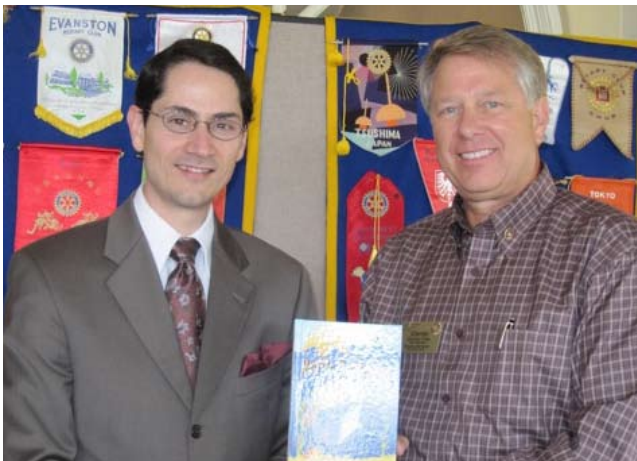
Our Fine Master for the day was Past President **Troy Daum** who demonstrated a skill in generating money.

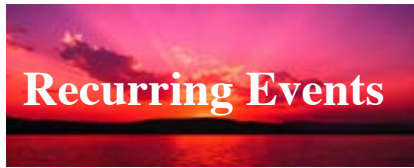
Guest speaker for the day was Navi Mehta from the San Diego Symphony.

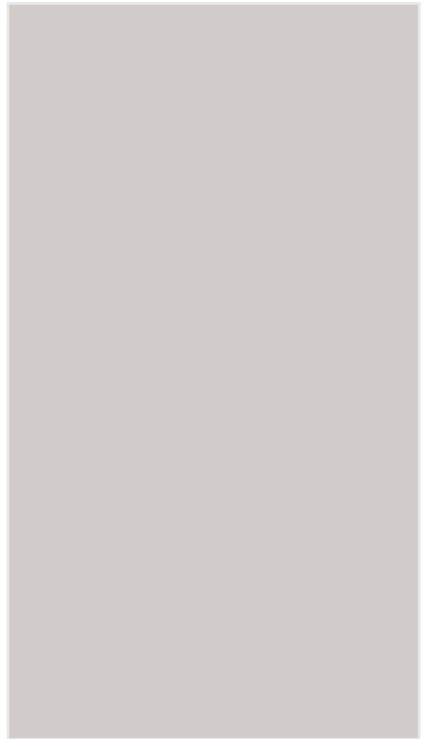
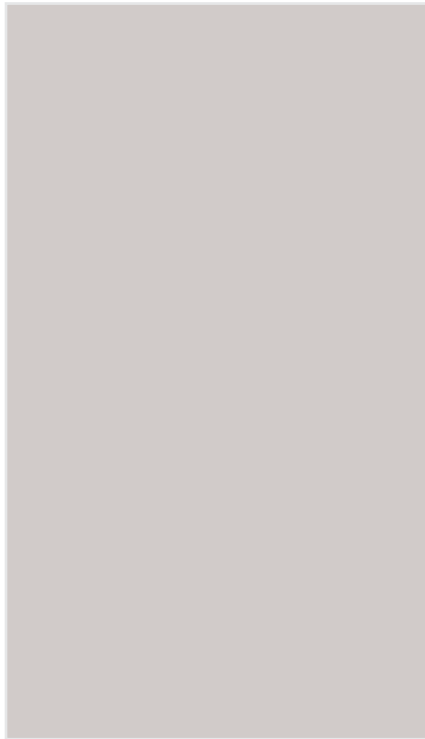
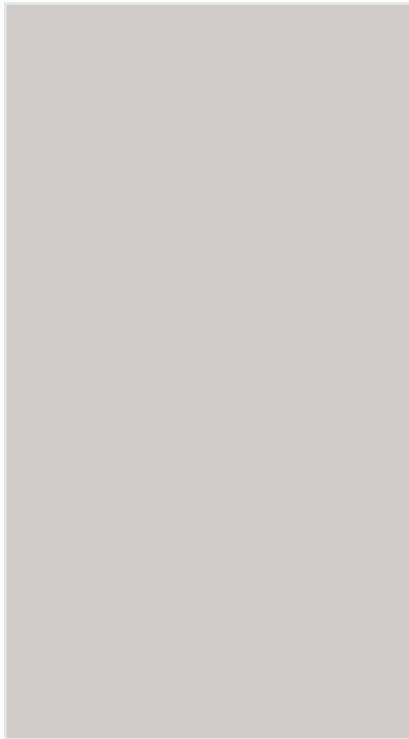
