4-Way Test Speech Contest on Thursday

Today's contest is a Sub-Regional contest, the second of four levels. Two winners from this competition will go on to a Regional contest held later this month. The winner of those contests will go to the Finals, which take place on May 12.

The 4-Way Test was conceived by RI Past President Herbert Taylor in 1932. It was officially adopted by RI in 1943 as a "short measuring stick of ethics" and has been widely publicized since that time. The speech contest we are hosting today has 3 goals:

- make high school students aware of the 4-Way Test;
- get the students thinking about how the 4-Way Test can be applied to their lives; and
- provide cash awards to students to further their education.

Rules for Competitors

Our competitors today have several rules to follow. Their speech may be no less than 5 minutes and no longer than 7 minutes. Penalty points will be assessed if the speech is too short or too long. They may use note cards, but may not read their speech. The use of the microphone is optional, as is where they stand during the speech.

Rules for the Audience

Do not applaud each speaker; wait until the end. Please do not leave or enter the room while a student is speaking, and do not speak to fellow members during that time. Silence your cell phones. We have asked the wait staff to suspend their clearing activities during the contest.

Thanks to our judges today: Arilla St. Laurent, Jason Salazar and Jim Sommer. They will be evaluating the speakers in four areas: content, organization, delivery and application of the 4-Way Test. Dave Brooks will be introducing the students and timing the speeches.

Rotary Foundation Board: Meets the 4th Wednesday of every third month at 4 p.m. at Rancho Financial in the conference room.

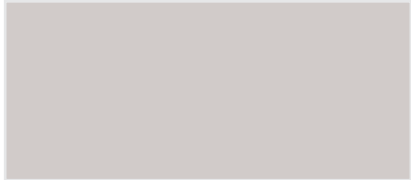
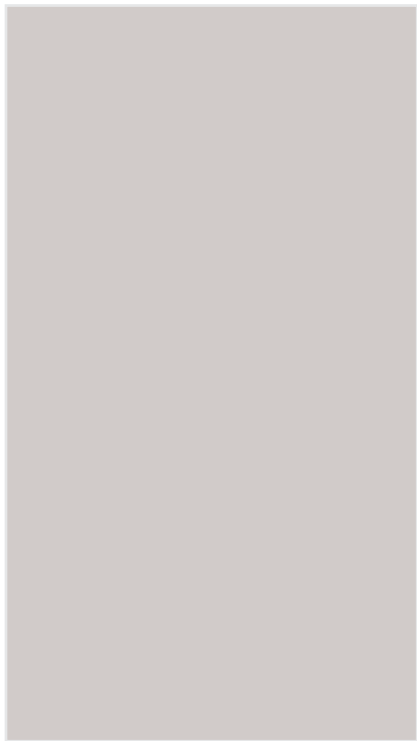
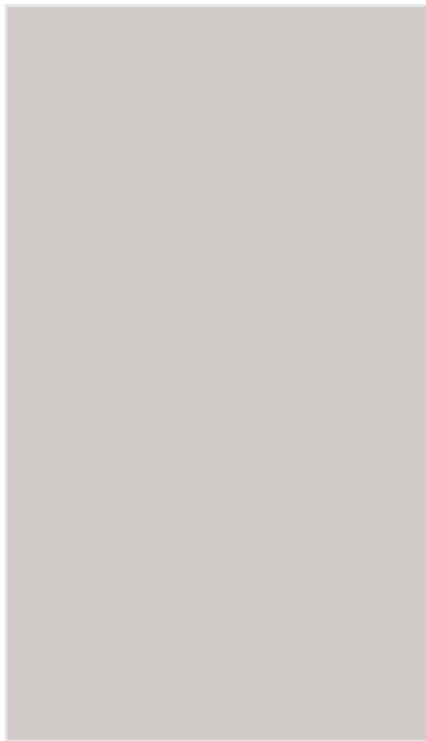
